Plan your BAdvSc(Hons) degree!

A BAdvSc(Hons) degree requires 64 units of study built from five different categories of courses, as below.

Important!

You must complete ≥4 units at Level 2 or higher and ≥2 units at Level 3 of "advanced courses".

You must not complete >20 units at Level 1.

Unsure about what major(s) to take?

That's fine. You do not have to declare a major in 1st year unless you want to. It is often a good idea to use your first year of study to explore and learn what areas interest you. BUT be aware that most majors require up to two Level 1 prerequisite courses in addition to the Level 1 course that forms part of the major. Therefore, spend some time on the <u>program information site</u> looking into majors that interest you and ensure that you complete their prerequisite courses. This will help you keep your options open until 2nd year. If you are interested in enrolling in multiple plans* that share courses in common, <u>this video</u> explains how to do so.
